ACTIVITIES

On 17 July, we placed an advertisement for a Social Development/Climate Change Policy Expert.

PROJECT OUTPUTS

In July, we continued to organise weekly meetings with the Climate Change Adaptation and Local Policies Department of the Ministry of Environment, Urbanization and Climate Change to discuss the planning of project activities.

On 8 July, we conducted an online meeting with project experts to discuss the development of long-term strategies and sectoral awareness training modules planned under Activity 3.2.3.

We held the 39th Operational Coordination Meeting with the participation of UNDP management at the Directorate of Climate Change on 11 July. Training, including the grant programme, study visit and launch of the Climate Portal were among the topics addressed during the meeting.

We started preparations for the study visit to the Netherlands scheduled to take place in August. To this end, we held an online coordination meeting for the visit on 16 July, as well as planning the organisation.

We held a meeting with the Climate Change Adaptation and Local Policies Department on 18 July to discuss the e-NASAP M&E system which had been adapted in line with feedback. Discussions between the experts and the relevant technical department are ongoing.

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On 22 July, we had a meeting with the Directorate of Climate Change on the development of UASAPs and related indicators.

On 26 July, we had a meeting to discuss the consultative meetings planned as part of the project. We reviewed the training modules prepared by sector experts with the Directorate of Climate Change on 29 July.

We organised the pilot sectoral training focusing on energy, industry and public health on 30–31 July at the Occidental Hotel in Ankara to raise awareness among local stakeholders. The training, attended by 50 local stakeholders from public institutions, private sector and universities covered topics such as sectoral adaptation options and recommendations as well as good practices and sectoral risks.

GRANT PROGRAMME

As part of the grant programme, grant experts made a monitoring visit to the municipality of Bornova on 2 July.

The status of 29 projects under the grant programme was reviewed, and risk assessments were made following the 39th Operational Coordination Meeting on 11 July.

The brochure introducing 29 projects implemented in 16 different provinces under the Grant Programme under the Climate Change Adaptation Grant Programme was published.



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
